Who we are:

Since our founding nearly 25 years ago, Rebuilding Together Pittsburgh's mission is to bring volunteers and communities together to improve the homes and lives of low-income homeowners in need by providing critical home repairs, at no cost. We believe everyone deserves a home that is both safe and healthy.



We also know that restoring homes and improving the lives of the homeowners has a direct impact on the surrounding community. While Rebuilding Together Pittsburgh works in homes all over Allegheny County, in the past few years, we have focused more on Impact Neighborhoods—communities in Pittsburgh left behind by the overall economic recovery. Our focus extends beyond the individual homeowner to revitalizing and stabilizing vulnerable neighborhoods and communities across the county. Working alongside representatives from these target communities, we are able to strategically and efficiently bring private resources and home repair expertise to aid in redevelopment and preservation efforts.

What we do:

Rebuilding Together Pittsburgh repairs and renovates the homes of low-income elderly homeowners, military veterans, and individuals with permanent physical disabilities in Allegheny County. RTP helps homeowners with a variety of health and safety repairs, including carpentry, plumbing, electrical, masonry, flooring, safety modifications such as grab bars and handrails, plastering, painting, and occasional roofing repairs.
